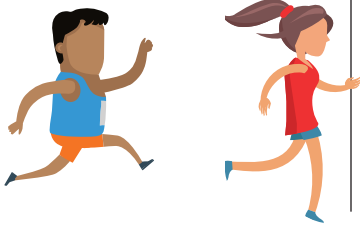


Fine Arts Program

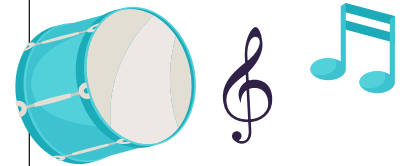
